Meet Amulya

An Udayan Ghar Child

Amulya was rescued at six years old from the streets of Delhi, coming under the aegis the Udayan Ghar program in 2006. Nothing was known about her past or her family, and as a child with a below-average IQ, Amulya was particularly vulnerable.

With her entrance into the Udayan Ghar program, Amulya acquired a new family and benefited from having every possible resource at her disposal. She was diagnosed with and given a treatment regimen for epilepsy, and she was enrolled in a school for children with special needs. She also received the full support of Udayan Care's social work and mental health professionals, as well as the love and nurturing of her mentor parents, caregivers, and Udayan siblings. In time, Amulya began to blossom into a more outgoing and confident young lady.

With the encouragement of her Udayan family, she found her true passion in sports-where she excelled beyond anything they could have imagined. In March of this

year Amulya participated in the Special Olympics in Abu Dhabi, where she won a bronze medal in the 100 meter dash and placed 4th in the 200 meter dash (pictured above).

Now 19 years old, she is being supported through the Udayan After Care Program. She is training for the next Special Olympics, hoping to bring home gold next time around. Amulya is a shining example of how Udayan Care's commitment to giving the best life possible to each and every child under its care is changing our world for the better. Coming to the Udayan Ghar program with every disadvantage, Amulya has proven that she's now ready to conquer the world.

New Shalinis



This fall Udayan Care inducted 487 new Shalinis across ten chapters -- Kurukshetra, Haridwar, North Delhi, Gurgaon, Greater Noida, Dehradun, Jaipur, Aurangabad, Mumbai, and Vadodara. By the end of 2019, the Udayan Shalini Fellowship Program will have enrolled 1,300 new fellows, swelling the ranks of the Shalini family to nearly 9,000 strong. It will also soon begin inducting young women into the 21st USF chapter in Noida, Uttar Pradesh.
