Meet Abinaya
A Shalini Fellowship Student - Chennai

Abinaya grew up in a low-income family--the daughter of a machine operator and a domestic worker. Her family's economic struggles made it difficult to afford school tuition for her and her sister, but her parents desperately wanted both girls to succeed. Abinaya was driven, too. She would study day and night, sequestering herself on a small balcony so as not to disturb the others in her two-room home. She remembers that her mother used to wake up at 4am and bring her milk, anxious to help her daughter succeed.

Becoming a Shalini fellow in 2017 ensured that Abinaya would have the opportunity to continue her studies and pursue her dream of becoming a scientist. But it also gave her a whole new set of skills and resources to help her on her way. "Within 10 months I saw a drastic difference in my personality," she claims, "Before I didn't take initiative...Also I didn't have that much confidence." She's gained both as a Shalini fellow, and as a result she has excelled both in and outside of school.

Now Abinaya is pursuing her B.S. in Physics at one of the best universities in Chennai. When the pandemic hit, the Udayan Shalini Fellowship stepped in to provide her and her family with food and support. USF also helped to secure internet access so that she could continue her studies online, and her local chapter has also set up virtual workshops and supplementary classes to help Abinaya and her sister fellows. In a crisis that is hitting the most vulnerable the hardest, the Udayan Shailini Fellowship program is helping to ensure that the futures of bright young women like Abinaya are not another casualty of its ravages.

Going Digital



When India went into lockdown this spring, Indian schools transitioned to online learning virtually overnight. While this transition has been difficult everywhere, it has been particularly so in places like India, where less than 40% of people have access to the internet (compared to 90% in the US). Udayan Care is working to provide access to all the children in its 17 Ghars, as well as to online resources, daily Zoom Yoga and Zumba classes,

and interhome activities like "Quizantine" contests. The process has been aided by Udayan Care's Emergency Response Fund. You can <u>donate now</u> to help ensure equal access for UC's Ghar children.
