

Meet Vijay Patel
An UCUSA Donor Making a Difference

Vijay Patel first stumbled across the Udayan Shalini Fellowship in an online

search. Mr. Patel emigrated to the United States in 1983, and since then he has enjoyed a successful career as an engineer and manager--working for the last two decades at HP. Yet Mr. Patel has always maintained a strong connection to his native India. He has also nurtured an abiding interest in education; both his father and grandfather were teachers, and he credits them with teaching him the transcendent value of education. Together, these interests led him to his fateful discovery of the Udayan Shalini Fellowship. It was the holistic approach to girls' education that drew Mr. Patel to the program. The USF does not merely provide funding, he explains; it provides all the necessary support for young women to succeed--from mentorship and skills workshops to leadership training and confidence-building. Excited by the opportunities that the USF offered disadvantaged young women in India, Mr. Patel threw his support behind the program. He did not merely make a donation, however. Launching a virtual 6,000 kilometer bicycle trip across India, Mr. Patel exhorted his friends, family, and coworkers to support the Shalini program, spreading awareness as well as raising funds for the organization. He also enlisted the help of his company, capitalizing upon HP's generous matching program and its strong commitment to philanthropy. Moreover he directed much of this energy and support to opening a new Udayan Shalini chapter in Ahmedabad in the western state of Gujarat. He has been involved in every step of that process, from inception and fundraising all the way down to fellowship interviews and Shalini workshops. And Mr. Patel's dream is now a reality, and the Udayan Shalini Fellowship is transforming the lives of girls in Ahmedabad. Mr. Patel is a shining example of the difference donors like you can make to the lives of disadvantaged women and children in India--and that donors can make an impact far beyond their financial contributions.
