Meet Narmdi!

An Udayan Ghar Alumnus

When Narmdi was young, she lost both her mother and her father. She and her sister found themselves orphaned, with no one to care for them and nowhere to stay. Yet Narmdi was determined to take care of her younger sister, who was too young to understand what had happened to them. That was how they survived until they were spotted by the police and placed in an orphanage. Finally, in 2013, the girls found a permanent and stable home in the Udayan Ghar in Vikram Vihar, New Delhi.

In her new home, Narmdi flourished. She blossomed under the care and guidance of her Mentor Mother and the professional and care staff in her life. Narmdi threw herself into school, and all of her diligent studying--and all the help she gave to her sister--really paid off. She scored a 93.6% in her twelfth grade final exams. Narmdi and all her Ghar sisters were elated.

It was not all work and no play for Narmdi, however. Even with all the time

she dedicated to her studies, she developed a deep passion for art. One of her works was featured in the Hindustan times, and when it came time to think about higher education, Narmdi decided to pursue art as a career. She won the Annesha Wadhwa Talent Scholarship (named for late Udayan Care USA board member Aneesha Wadhwa) and earned a place in the prestigious BFA program at Jamia Milia Islamia. Recently, she was also awarded the "Learning in Fellowship Together" (or LIFT) Fellowship, aimed at helping Care Leavers to become agents of change.
